Since its start in 1792, the *Almanac* has provided useful information on a variety of subjects, many especially related to farm life and the farm family.

The occupants were farmers and harvested the tall pines that grew along West Neck Creek, sending them down the waterways to provide timber for the shipbuilders in Norfolk.

DID YOU KNOW?

Standard time, law in 1883, was promoted by U.S. and Canadian railroads for better travel and communication. Train guards using different times had resulted in multiple accidents with fatalities, reported as early as 1853.

Standard Time Act 1918, launching Daylight Savings Time, was meant to conserve energy resources during WWI. It was implemented again during WWII. The Uniform Time Act 1966 standardized DST but allowed local jurisdictions to opt out.

It was permanent in 1974 and 1975, but start dates were backed up to January and February during those years in response to the energy crisis.

DST was extended by 3 weeks in 1987 and 4-5 weeks in 2007. The Sunshine Protection Act 2022 seeking to make DST the permanent standard was passed by the Senate but not the House.

Some medical professionals are now lobbying for the elimination of DST altogether. They note the importance of circadian rhythms and express concern about the affect time changes have on physical and mental health due to the disruption of our internal clocks.

For now, we still "spring forward and fall back". So enjoy some fresh air and take advantage of the extra time in the sun.
