A FEW WORDS FROM PHYLLIS

July brings to mind the heritage that the early Princess Anne residents left for us.

The 8.5 acres of city owned property leased to the WBHF and the acreage of the West Neck Creek Nature Area behind us are all that remain of the large land grant received by Richard Whitehurst.

Stretching down to the West Neck River, a community emerged. The nearby forests supported a thriving lumber business, and logs were shipped down the river for shipbuilding and other uses. Legend has it an ancient Cypress tree still exists on the Whitehurst side of the river, a remnant of what once stood there.

The 1793 house and grounds we see today is precious heritage that our Foundation seeks to maintain and preserve for future generations as we join in the celebration of our country's 246th birthday.

INDEPENDENCE DAY

July 4th. The holiday begins to mind parades, concerts, barbeques, and, of course, fireworks. Maybe you recall canons firing during the "1812 Overture" performed by the Boston Pops Orchestra.

It was a long struggle to official liberty, and Virginia played a key part. In May 1776 Virginia voted to declare independence from Great Britain. The Virginia Resolution proposed by Richard Henry Lee was taken to the 2nd Continental Congress. They approved the first part of Lee's Resolution to separate from the crown on July 2, 1776. The Declaration of Independence was adopted two days after the vote.

Bonfires & ringing bells to herald the king's birthday were replaced with mock funerals. In 1777 Philadelphia held an Independence Day commemoration that included firing of 13 rockets before and after the event as well as a 13-gun salute.

On June 9th Councilwoman Barbara Henley met with a small group of community members. They reviewed a proposal for a trail extending from the West Neck Creek Natural Area through the wooded area behind where Kellam & Eaton stood to the Foxfire neighborhood. Mrs. Henley hopes to establish a larger group for future meetings and proposals.

In 1781 Massachusetts was the first to declare Independence Day a state celebration. In 1941 Congress expanded the July 4th Holiday (1870) to a paid federal holiday. Military bases still fire a Salute to the Nation, and the Liberty Bell is tapped 13 times for the original colonies.

Take a moment to reflect on the diplomatic fervor and the sacrifices that championed our independence.

It ought to be commemorated as the Day of Deliverance . . . It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with Shews, Games, Sports, Guns. Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more. (John Adams, July 3, 1776)
