Updates on future events will be posted to our FaceBook page and website wbhouse.org as they are available.


BOARD MEMBER RESIGNATION AND

a August marked the 100th anniversary for malfunction in the breaker box at the ratification of the 19th Amendment giving women the right to vote.

> Most would be familiar with the NWSA (Cady Elizabeth Stanton and Susan B. Anthony) established in 1869.

> But in 1909 influential women in Richmond formed the Equal Suffrage League of Va. By 1916 there were 115 chapters from almost every town in the state, including Princess Anne County.

> A 1914 announcement in Virginia Suffrage News notes 20 members who maintain "an educational and social center at the Oceanna High School".

> State secretary Ida Mae Thompson kept detailed records, even reaching out in the 1930s for materials to include in the archives, now part of the Library of Virginia. A response from a former local member's daughter was signed Louise Land Meyn / Mrs. Henry C. Meyn. It notes additional former members Mrs. C. DeWitt, Mrs. Chas Ingram, Mrs. Frank T. Washington and Mrs. Ida Thomas.

> Members successfully worked legislation affecting women and children while lobbying for the vote. They disbanded September 1920. In October over 13,000 Va. women were registered.

DID YOU KNOW

Whitehurst family members were involved in changes made in Princess Anne County (established 1691).

In 1820/1823 Daniel Whitehurst was appointed Commissioner and authorized construction of a new courthouse and jail on property near his farm. The former 1778 courthouse was in Kempsville.



In 1872 his descendant, also named Daniel Whitehurst, was one of the trustees establishing the Mount Zion African Methodist Episcopal Church. Mount Zion exists today on Princess Anne Road near Seaboard Road.
